

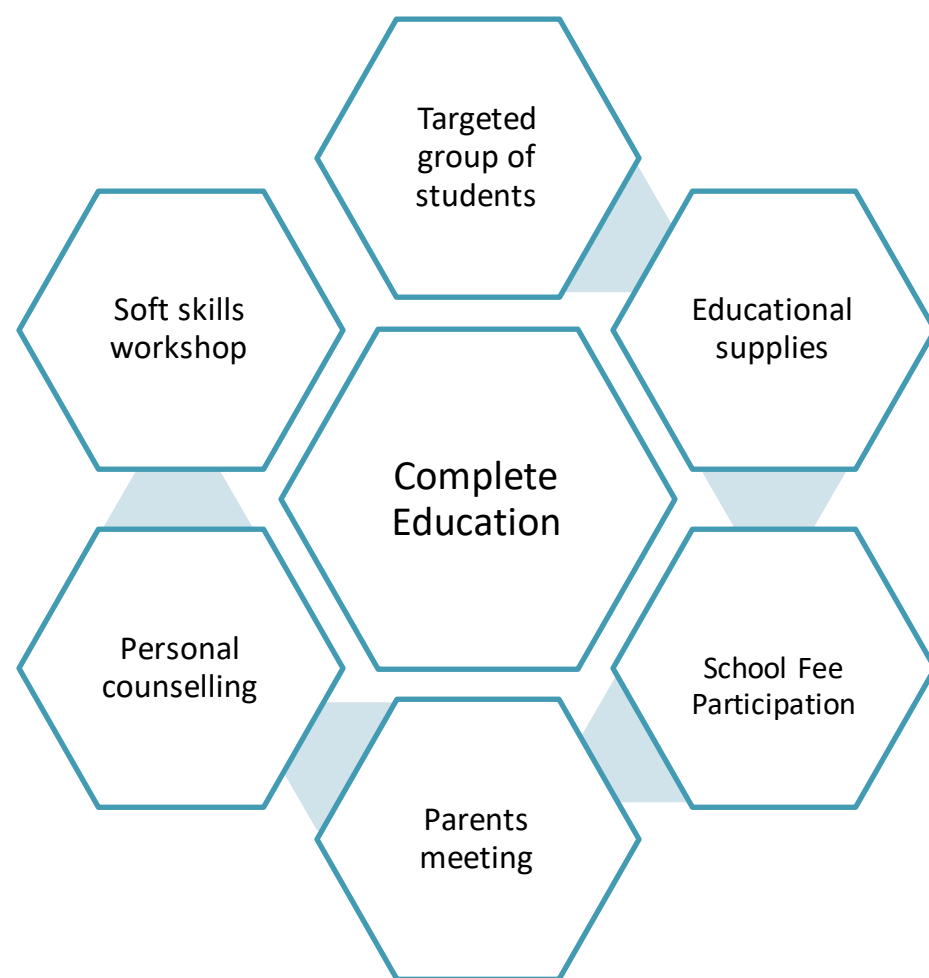

# Success model

We chose students with great care and provide them with a comprehensive support. Since 1992, more than 41,000 annual scholarships have been provided to disadvantaged children.



## Relationship and Trust

We visit students at their homes to assess their needs and build the relationship with not only the children themselves but their parents/ caregivers.

We organize regular meetings with parents and caregivers to ensure we keep track of students’ circumstances not only at school but also at home and interfere immediately when it needed (i.e. child marriage, child labour, etc.).



## Financial Assistance

We provide basic educational supplies and school fees to relieve the financial burden of education on family’s income.

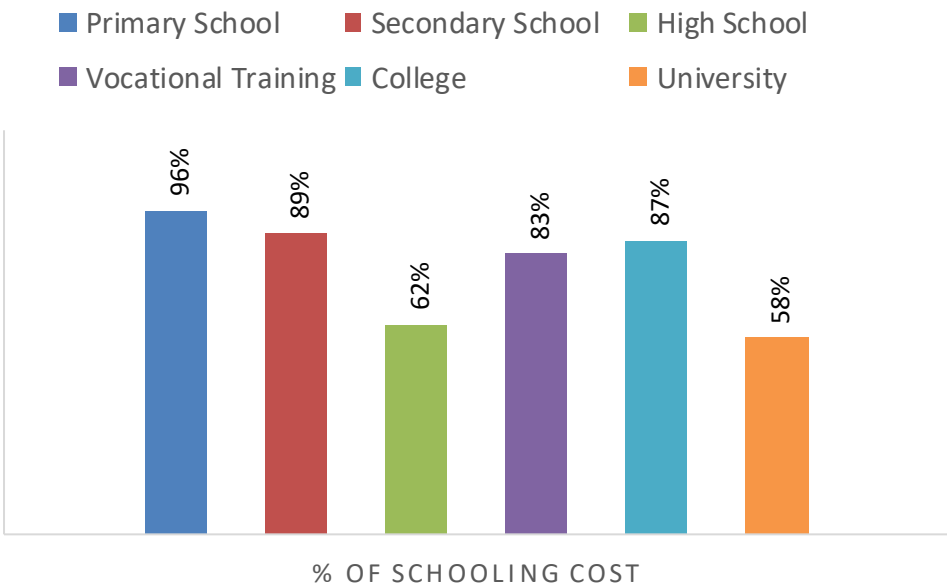
As our principles of not creating dependency, we do not provide all the school fees but require certain level of contribution from the families. We do not replace the families’ responsibilities in their child’s development.



## Non-financial Assistance

Financial assistance is not enough in the development of any child. To reduce the opportunity gap for children from disadvantaged background in rural areas, we provide soft-skills training and personal counselling to help reach their full potential.

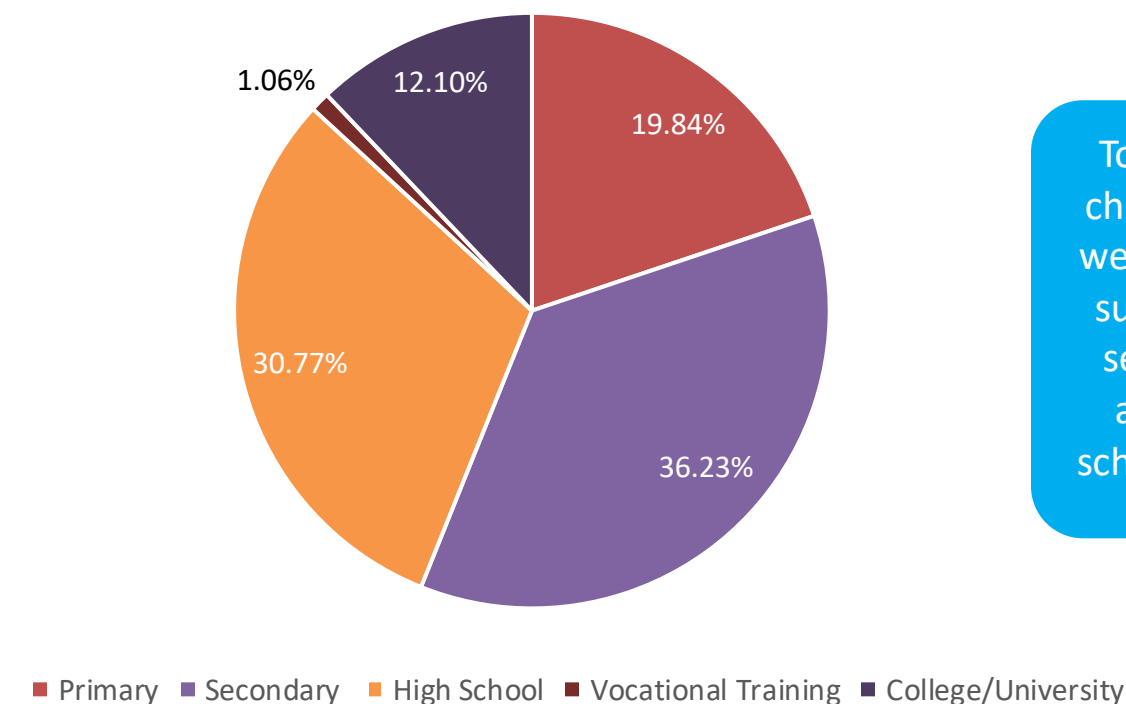


We also digitalized our data collection process to gather data on-time and more accurate.

To prevent child labour, we focus our support on secondary and high school levels.





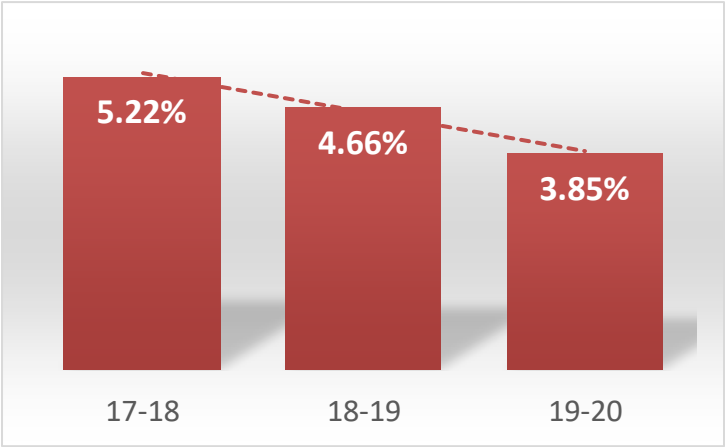
EDUCATION COMPLETION

With your support, **1,685** students from the most struggling families were able to complete another education year. **95.6%** of them completed with the average or above average rankings.

Among them, **77** graduated from high school ad **60** students are ready to join the workforce with a decent diploma. On average, post high school graduates' income is about **2.31 times** of their parents/ caregivers with a career path.

DROP-OUT RATE

Despite of all hardship in this school year, the drop-out rate of our students continue to decrease given that the demography of our target group are the same.

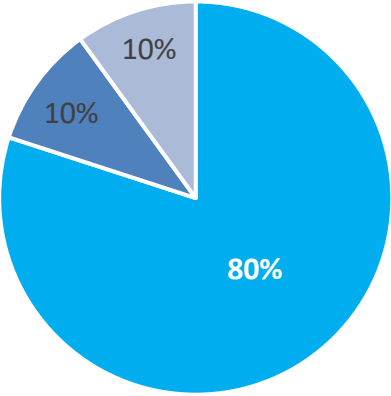
